

NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION

TO THE RESIDENT, QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE
COLLINSVILLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in the Collinsville Independent School District on November 7, 2023 concerning the issuance of bonds in accordance with an order that reads substantially as follows:

ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS
GRAYSON AND COOKE COUNTIES
COLLINSVILLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Collinsville Independent School District (the “District”) deems it advisable to call the bond election hereinafter ordered (the “Election”); and

WHEREAS, the bond referendum is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Cooke County, Texas (“*Cooke County*”) and Grayson County, Texas (“*Grayson County*”, and together with Cooke County, the “*Contracting Counties*”) for the administration of the Election pursuant to an interlocal agreement with the Contracting Counties (the “*Election Contract*”); and

WHEREAS, Cooke County, acting through the Cooke County Elections Administrator (the “*Cooke County Elections Administrator*”) in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Cooke County, and Grayson County, acting through the Grayson County Elections Administrator (the “*Grayson County Elections Administrator*”, together with the Cooke County Elections Administrator, the “*Elections Administrators*”) in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election for residents of the District residing in Grayson County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE
COLLINSVILLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Section 1. The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and adopted as findings of fact and operative provisions hereof.

Section 2. *Election Ordered; Polling Places.* The Election shall be held in the District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on November 7, 2023 (“*Election Day*”). The Election is to be conducted and administered by the Contracting Counties as provided by Chapter 271 and Chapter 31, Subchapter D of the Texas Election Code (the “*Code*”), and the Election Contract. Election Day and Early Voting shall occur on the dates and during the hours and at the designated polling places as set forth in Exhibit “A” attached hereto, which exhibit is hereby made a part

hereof for all intents and purposes. Exhibit “A” shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places required to conform to the Election Contract and the Code.

Section 3. *Early Voting.* Early voting shall be administered by the Contracting Counties. Early Voting by personal appearance shall begin on October 23, 2023, and conclude on November 3, 2023 and will be conducted at the Early Voting locations on the dates and at the times specified in Exhibit “A” attached hereto. The early voting polling places shall remain open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance for any registered voter of the District at such voting place. Exhibit “A” shall be modified to include additional or different early voting polling places required to conform to the Election Contract and the Code.

Section 4. *Election Officials.* The appointment of the Presiding Election Judges, Alternate Judges, Early Voting Clerks, the Presiding Judge of the early ballot board and other election officials for the Election shall be made by the Elections Administrators.

Section 5. *Voting by Mail.* Applications for voting by mail for all residents of the District shall submitted by personal delivery or shall be mailed to the address below prior to the deadline prescribed by law:

Section 6. *Early Voting Ballots.* An Early Voting Ballot Board shall be created to process early voting results of the Election, and the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall be designated by the Elections Administrators. The Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot

Board shall appoint two or more additional members to constitute the Early Voting Ballot Board members and, if needed, the Signature Verification Committee members required to efficiently process the early voting ballots.

Section 7. Qualified Voters. All qualified electors of and residing in the District, shall be entitled to vote at the election.

Section 8. Proposition. At the Election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Collinsville Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$16,000,000 for the purpose of constructing, renovating, improving, equipping and demolishing school facilities consisting of new classrooms and offices at the existing elementary; a safety and security vestibule and HVAC upgrades at the high school, and demolition of the old elementary building; with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds?

Section 9. Ballots. The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code to permit the electors to vote “FOR” or “AGAINST” the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

Section 10. Compliance with Federal Law. In all respects, the Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code. Pursuant to the federal Help America Vote Act (“HAVA”) and the Code, at each polling place there shall be at least one voting system that is equipped for disabled individuals, and each such voting system shall be a system that has been certified by the Texas Secretary of State as compliant with HAVA and the Code. The District hereby finds that the voting system to be used by the Contracting Counties in administering the Election is such a system, and

orders that such voting equipment or other equipment certified by the Texas Secretary of State shall be used by the District in its elections.

Section 11. The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Superintendent, President, Vice President or the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute or attest on behalf of the District the Election Contract with the Contracting Counties.

Section 12. The following information is provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b), Texas Election Code.

(a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 9 hereof.

(b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 8 hereof.

(c) The principal amount of the debt obligations to be authorized is \$16,000,000 for Proposition A.

(d) If the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds.

(e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 6.5%. Such estimate considers several factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds or notes, or any series thereof, may be sold.

(f) If the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature serially, over a period not to exceed 30 years from the date of issuance of each series of bonds.

(g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$8,094,000, of which \$7,505,000 is secured by the District's interest and sinking tax rate and \$589,000 is secured by the District's maintenance and operations tax rate.

(h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest of the District's debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$4,161,914, of which \$4,132,075 is secured by the District's interest and sinking tax rate \$29,839 is secured by the District's maintenance and operations tax rate

(i) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District as of the date of this Order is \$0.19 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.

(1) The interest on the proposed bonds was estimated at a rate of 5.0% based on market conditions as of July 24, 2023, and therefore, the interest payable on the proposed bonds may be less than, or more than, the amounts set forth above based on market conditions at the time of sale of the proposed bonds.

Based on the information and assumptions provided in the table above, the estimated maximum annual increase in the amount of taxes that would be imposed on a residence homestead in the District with a taxable appraised value of \$100,000 to repay the proposed bonds, if approved, is \$282.12 (however, if the November 7, 2023 constitutional amendment increasing the residence homestead exemption amount to \$100,000 is approved, increase in the amount of taxes is \$0). This estimate assumes annual growth of District's taxable assessed valuation in the amount of 8% per year through tax year 2025, and holds the District's taxable assessed valuation constant thereafter and assumes that the proposed bonds will be issued in an amortization that will produce relatively consistent levels of debt service in each year.
