NOTICE TO BIDDER

By order of the Commissioners' Court of Cooke County, Texas, the County Auditor will receive sealed bids until **2:00 P.M., Thursday, April 11, 2024** for competitive bids on Gasoline and Diesel Fuel to be used by Cooke County for a period of twelve (12) months, beginning April 22, 2024. Funds for payment have been provided through the Cooke County budget approved by the Commissioners' Court for the fiscal year. Bidders must use lump sum pricing. Complete bid specifications are available at the Cooke County Auditor's Office or on Cooke County's website: <u>www.co.cooke.tx.us</u>. Sealed bids must be addressed to Cooke County Auditor's Office, 101 South Dixon, Gainesville, Texas 76240. No electronic bids will be accepted. Sealed bids must be in the office of the County Auditor on or before 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 11, 2024 in an envelope plainly marked "Bid No. FY24-04 – Bulk Fuel". Bids will be opened in the Cooke County Commissioners Courtroom located at 101 South Dixon St., Gainesville, Texas, 76240, on Thursday, April 11, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. Cooke County reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

COOKE COUNTY, TEXAS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Bids must give full company name and address of the bidder. Failure to manually sign bid will disqualify bid.
- 2. All bidders must complete the "Conflict of Interest Questionnaire". Chapter 176 of the Texas Local Government code requires that any vendor or person conducting business or wishing to conduct business with a county complete the questionnaire. It must be filed with the Cooke County Clerk. It is a Class C misdemeanor offense if a person violates Section 176.006, Local Government Code. Any questions can be directed to the Texas Ethics Commission in Austin.
- 3. It is understood that Cooke County, Texas reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all Bids for any or all products and/or services covered in an Invitation for Bid and to waive informalities or defects in submittals or to accept such submittals as it shall deem to be in the best interest of Cooke County.
- 4. All Invitation for Bids shall be submitted in hard copy paper form and shall be submitted in a sealed envelope, plainly marked on the outside with the bid and name. A hard copy paper form submittal shall be manually signed in ink by a person having the authority to bind the firm in a contract. Submittals shall be mailed or hand delivered to the Cooke County Auditor's Office.
- 5. Sealed bids will be opened on the date set forth in the Notice to Bidder and/or the Legal Notice.
- 6. Any explanation, clarification, or interpretation desired by a bidder regarding any part of the bid must be requested in writing from the Auditor's Office not less than five (5) business days before bid closing. Interpretations, corrections, or changes to the bid made in any other manner are not binding upon the County, and bidders shall not rely upon such interpretations, corrections or changes. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award of the contract are not binding. Request for explanations or clarifications may be e-mailed to <u>shelly.atteberry@co.cooke.tx.us</u>. Any written information given to one bidder concerning a bid will be furnished as an addendum to all bidders who have been issued a bid.
- 7. The requirement to furnish a Bid Security Bond and/or Performance Bond, when necessary, will be stated elsewhere in the Bid Specifications.
- 8. If ownership of your firm should change during the term of this contract, Cooke County must be notified (*Novation*) in writing within ten (10) days and a new declaration of relationships submitted immediately to the Cooke County Auditor's Office. Failure by the vendor to provide written notification of change of ownership may result in cancellation of the contract.
- 9. Cooke County is exempt from State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax; therefore, the prices submitted shall not include taxes.
- 10. All delivery and freight charges, please include quotes with F.O.B., are to be included as part of the bid price. All components required to render the item complete, installed, and operational shall be included in the total bid price. Cooke County will pay no additional freight/delivery/installation/set up fees.
- 11. The title and risk of loss of the goods shall not pass to buyer until buyer takes possession of the goods at the point(s) of delivery.
- 12. Escalation and De-escalation: It is agreed the unit price bid is based, in part, on prices charged or quoted at the time of this bid by a product supplier to the vendor. The unit price bid may be increased or decreased when a product supplier increases or decreases their price to the vendor; however, the increase or decrease in the unit price shall be limited to the amount of the increase or decrease in price a product supplier charges the vendor. Any change in the unit price bid shall be accompanied by supporting documents from the vendor's product supplier. The vendor shall provide notice to the county auditor in advance of any increase in the unit price bid. The county auditor will place the notices on the next Commissioner's Court agenda. Vendor will be notified if the price increase is approved. Cooke County reserves the rights to cease purchase of the product, purchase from the secondary bidder, re-bid or continue purchasing from the primary vendor if the unit price bid increases.

- 13. If delay is foreseen, contractor shall give written notice to the county auditor. Cooke County has the right to extend delivery date if reasons appear valid. Contractor must keep the county advised at all times of status of order. Default in promised delivery (without accepted reasons) or failure to meet specifications, authorizes the county to purchase supplies elsewhere and charge full increase in cost and handling to defaulting contractor.
- 14. All items proposed shall be new, in first class condition, including containers suitable for shipment and storage, unless otherwise indicated in bid. Verbal agreements to the contrary will not be recognized. All materials and services shall be subject to Purchaser's approval. Unsatisfactory material will be returned at Seller's expense.
- 15. Specifications may reference name brands, make, and/or model numbers. Any reference made to model/make and /or manufacturer used in specifications is for descriptive purposes only. Products/ materials of like quality will be considered. Cooke County shall act as sole judge in determining equality and acceptability of products offered.
- 16. The apparent silence of specifications as to any detail, or the apparent omission from it of a detailed description concerning any point, shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practice is to prevail and that only material and workmanship of the finest quality are to be used. All interpretations of specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement. The items furnished under this contract shall be new, unused of the latest product in production to commercial trade and shall be of the highest quality as to materials used and workmanship. Manufacturer furnishing these items shall be experienced in design and construction of such items and shall be an established supplier of the item bid.
- 17. Bidders are responsible for including all pertinent product data in the returned bid package. Literature, brochures, data sheets, specification information, completed forms requested as part of the bid package and any other facts which may affect the evaluation and subsequent contract award should be included. Materials such as legal documents and contractual agreements, which the bidder wishes to include as a condition of the bid, must also be in the returned bid package. Failure to include all necessary and proper supplemental materials may be cause to reject the entire Bid.
- 18. The bid will be awarded to the lowest and best bid and in the best interest of Cooke County. Contracts may be awarded to more than one bidder if it is in the best interest of Cooke County.
- 19. All bidders will comply with all Federal, State, and local laws relative to conducting business in Cooke County including, but not limited to licensing, labor and health laws. The laws of the State of Texas will govern as to the interpretation, validity and effect of this bid, its award, and any contract entered into.
- 20. The successful bidder agrees, by entering into this contract, to defend, indemnify and hold Cooke County harmless from any and all courses of action of claims of damages arising out of or related to bidder's performance under this contract.
- 21. Upon signing this bid document, an bidder offering to sell supplies, materials, services, or equipment to Cooke County certifies that the bidder has not violated the antitrust laws of this state codified in Texas Business and Commerce Code §15.01, et seq., as amended, or the federal antitrust laws, and has not communicated directly or indirectly the bid made to any competitor or any other person engaged in such line of business. Any or all bids may be rejected if the County believes that collusion exists among the bidders. Bids in which the prices are obviously unbalanced may be rejected. If multiple bids are submitted by a bidder and after the bids are opened, one of the bids is withdrawn, the result will be that all of the bids submitted by that bidder will be withdrawn; however, nothing herein prohibits a vendor from submitting multiple bids for different products or services.
- 22. Acceptance of and final payment for the item will be contingent upon satisfactory performance of the product received by Cooke County.
- 23. Successful Bidder shall submit separate invoices, in duplicate, on each purchase order. Invoices shall be itemized and transportation charges, if any, shall be listed separately. Mail to Cooke County, Accounts Payable, 101 S. Dixon, Gainesville, Texas 76240. Payments shall not be due until the above instruments are submitted after delivery.

- 24. It is expressly understood and agreed that in case Cooke County should need any item(s) not available within the time frame requested from the successful vendor during the term of this contract, Cooke County reserves the right to purchase these items from other than the successful vendor. This shall not be in violation of any terms or conditions of said contract. Further, Cooke County reserves the right to seek another vendor if, any time, vendor's prices do not conform to public pricing.
- 25. The price to be paid by the Buyer shall be that contained in Seller's bid which Seller warrants to be no higher than the Seller's current prices on orders by others for products of the same kind and specification covered by this agreement for similar quantities under similar or like conditions and methods of purchase. In the event Seller breaches this warranty, the prices of the items shall be reduced to the Seller's current prices on order by others, or the alternative, Buyer may cancel this contract without liability to Seller for breach or Seller's actual expense.
- 26. Seller shall not limit or exclude any implied warranties and any attempt to do so shall render this contract voidable at the option of the Buyer. Seller warrants that the goods furnished will conform to the specifications, drawings and descriptions listed in the bid invitation, and to the sample(s) furnished by Seller, if any. In the event of a conflict between the specifications, drawings, and descriptions, the specifications shall govern.
- 27. Seller warrants that the product sold to Buyer shall conform to the standards promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. In the event the product does not conform to OSHA standards, buyer may return the product for correction or replacement at the Sellers expense. In the event Seller fails to make the appropriate correction within a reasonable time, correction made by Buyer will be at Seller's expense.
- 28. Bidder and bidder's insurance carrier waive any and all rights whatsoever with regard to subrogation against Cooke County as an indirect party to any suit arising out of personal or property damages resulting from bidder's performance under this agreement.
- 29. No officer or employee of the County shall have a financial interest, direct or indirect, in any contract with the County, or shall be financially interested, directly or indirectly, in the sale to the County of any land, materials, supplies or service, except on behalf of the County as an officer or employee. Any willful violation of this section shall constitute malfeasance in office and any officer or employee guilty thereof shall be subject to removal from his office or position. Any violation of this section, with the knowledge, expressively implied, of the person or corporation contracting with the County shall render the contract voidable by the Commissioners' Court.
- 30. Any interpretation, corrections or changes to these specifications will be made by addenda. Sole issuing authority of addenda shall be vested in the Cooke County Auditor, authorized to do so by the Commissioners Court. Addenda will be mailed to all who are known to have received a copy of the specifications. Bidders shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda.

SPECIFICATIONS AND CONDITIONS FOR BULK FUEL

SCOPE: This bid is for the purchase of bulk fuels to be delivered to various locations in Cooke County. Bidder must also be able to furnish local storage and dispersing equipment for gasoline and diesel fuel to be used, on Bidder's site, by the Cooke County Sheriff's Department and for the Cooke County Emergency Medical Service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. The bidder must furnish programmable and trackable fuel cards for the bidder fuel disbursement system. Bidder fuel system must be able to print fuel receipts at fuel pumps at time of purchase. The quantities listed on the bid invitation are estimates. Cooke County does not guarantee that these are the amounts that will be purchased. Fuel will be purchased on an as needed basis. Approximate gallons of usage for October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023 were as follows:

PRICING: Bid date for market comparison will be March 25,2024. This contract shall be a discount-from-list type with the prices to be based on a firm cent per gallon discount from the suppliers posted rack price at the time of delivery. This discount shall remain firm for the term of the contract. The term of this contract is twelve (12) months; failure to bid a twelve (12) month contract may result in disqualification of the bid. Contract is for the FY24 fiscal budget year beginning April 22, 2024 through April 21, 2025. The price quoted shall include the following:

A copy of the refiners posed rack price and the appropriated OPIS for January 26, 2023, must accompany the bid.

<u>BID AWARD</u>: Cooke County will award this bid, by item or in total, to the bidder who submitted the lowest total price based on appropriate OPIS daily report for April 11, 2024, plus the vendor mark-up (margin of profit and freight charge).

DELIVERY AND INVOICING: A delivery ticket must accompany each shipment and the delivery ticket shall include a terminal fill receipt with gallons shown. Payment shall be based on day of delivery OPIS report for each product delivered. Successful bidder agrees to furnish Cooke County a copy of the appropriate OPIS daily report(s) with each invoice.

Deliveries are to be invoiced separately and each invoice shall designate the department receiving the fuel. Invoice shall be accompanied by a copy of the OPIS report at the time of delivery.

Product Specifications: Fuels to be supplied on this contract shall be identified on the face of the bid invitation and may include any of the following:

ORDERING INFORMATION: Bidder shall indicate, on the bid invitation, the contact information to place delivery orders; this includes the contact name and phone number. Fuel shall be delivered, from the time that the order was placed, within two (2) working days. For the purpose of this contract, working days are Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., excluding County Holidays.

PUMP STATION: The County's Sheriff's Department and Emergency Medical Service require a LOCAL pump station with the contracted vendor to be accessible 24 hours a day, 7 day a week, 365 days a year. Pump stations must have programmable and trackable fuel cards issued to each unit for Cooke County. Pump stations must also have receipts available at fuel pumps at time of purchase.

Product Specifications: Fuels to be supplied on this contract shall be identified on the face of the bid invitation and may include any of the following:

 Regular Unleaded gasoline, ASTM Designation D439 (most recent issue) with a minimum octane rating of 87 (R+M/2 method).

- 2. Regular Unleaded gasoline Ethanol Free, ASTM Designation D439 (most recent issue) with a minimum octane rating of 87 (R+M/2 method).
- 3. Ultra-Low Sulfur #2 Diesel Fuel, ASTM Designation D975 (most recent issue with a minimum octane number of 40), with lubricity additives.

FAILURE TO DELIVER: Cooke County reserves the right to purchase product on the open market, with no penalties or cancellation by the vendor, if delivery is not made within the specified time set forth in this contract. The County will bill the vendor the difference between the price in the contract and the open market price. Cooke County also reserves the right the cancel the contract for failure to perform to the specifications of the contract.

SPILLAGE AND CLEAN UP: The vendor shall be held responsible for all spillage that may occur during transit and unloading operations. Vendor shall clean up and report any and all spillage immediately and report said spillage and clean up to the Cooke County Environmental Department, at 940.668.5454. Failure to do so shall initiate corrective action and back charge to the vendor for any incurred costs by the County.

QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDER: Bidders must, at Cooke County's request, furnish satisfactory evidence of their ability to furnish the products or services in accordance with the terms and conditions of these specifications. The County reserves the right to make the final determination of the bidder's ability to furnish products or services.

Cooke County is prohibited from contracting with companies who boycott Israel and from investing in companies that boycott Israel.

Cooke County may not enter into a contract with a company that does business with Iran, Sudan, or any known terrorist organization.
